

CAVITY TCO OPENING AFTER LONG USE OF HIGH HEAT


Calls have been reported concerning the 120 volt Advantium ovens stopping in the middle of cooking. During long bake or high heat cycles, the cavity TCO can open causing the unit to stop functioning.

To prevent this from reoccurring install kit WB49X10149. The kit contains a new wave guide cover and outlet duct. This new design helps to insulate the thermostat from external temperatures and provides a more accurate measurement of cavity temperature.


1. Remove the outer case and grille.




2. Remove the stirrer motor cover.




3. Remove the wave guide cover and discard.




- 4. Remove the outlet duct.
 - Disconnect the thermostat wiring from the thermostat (1).
 - Remove the humidity sensor from the duct (2).
 - Unfasten the hold-down for the humidity sensor ground wire (3).
 - Discard the old outlet duct and thermostat.




5. Mount the humidity sensor on the new outlet duct and install the duct.




6. Reconnect the thermostat wiring on the new thermostat, placing the wires through the insulated cover exactly as shown in the illustration below.



7. Relocate the hold-down for the humidity sensor ground wire as shown below.



8. Install the new wave guide cover and reassemble the unit. Test for proper operation.
